## An Effective Orientation: What your students need to know

Here are some important items that your students need to know at the beginning of a preceptorship:

- The physical layout of the placement
- Where you work and how to find you
- Who to go to if you aren't available
- Their workspace, including computer and telephone access
- The location of any equipment they will be using
- The names and positions of staff they will be working with
- Dress code
- Where and when to eat and take breaks
- Location of bathrooms
- Where to store their things
- The chain of command at the unit/agency
- Daily schedule, including when they are expected to arrive and leave for the day
- The general culture of the agency (i.e. how formal an environment is your unit; political mandate, if appropriate; your colleagues' roles; previous students' roles)
